ROTARY CASH FOR CANS



The Rotary Club of Sunbury has recently taken over the **cash4cans** recycling centre at the Sunbury train station car park.

The collection cage is open every second and fourth Saturday of the month for community groups, or members of the public, to deposit their used aluminium cans in, from 9am-11am.

The Rotarians weigh the deposited cans and pay you for their weight at 70cents per kilo.

The cage is picked up when it's full and taken to the recycling depot.

The Rotary Club is paid for the cans based, once again, on the weight.

The funds are then returned to the community through projects such as:

- Bangers on Brook: A sausage sizzle and water for nightclub patrons every second Saturday night from 12:00 to 2:00am.
- Improvements to the Rotary Park on Ligar Street.
- Annual spelling competition for the local primary schools
- Through the Community Health Centre the club provides funds for help to families experiencing hard times.
- Various vocational events such as "Pride of Worksmanship", and "Stories on O'Shanassy" .
- For some years now we have had in place a "Sports and Recreation Foundation" that provides some funding for budding sportspeople, educational scholarships and recreation.
